

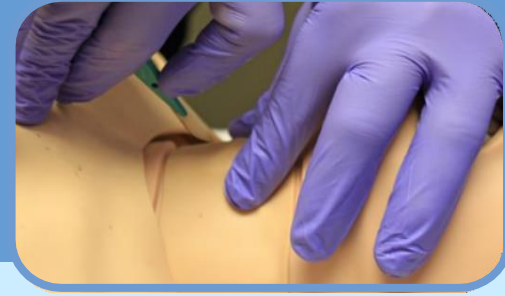
# ADAPT

## Airway Decisions and Process Training

**A one day course for Anaesthetists (from stage 2 trainees to consultants) that aims to equip individuals with strategies for managing adult patients with airway obstruction through integrated learning of technical skills and human factors that influence decision-making. It is geared towards individuals who do not have regular ENT/MaxFax sessions, but could be presented with such patients as a complication of routine care or whilst on-call.**

The course will:-

- Generate discussions on human performance limitations, decision-making processes and the use of guidelines.
- Facilitate a panel-led discussion on the pathophysiology of airway problems and how this influences decision-making using case presentations.
- Utilise mastery learning principles to ensure delegates gain experience in the following skills: Intubation via SAD, Nasendoscopy, HFNO/Optiflow set-up and emergency surgical airway.
- Culminate in an immersive simulation session followed by a facilitated debrief focusing on the human factors and challenges of decision-making in these complex clinical emergency situations.

**Please note this course does not aim to cover airway emergencies in the intensive care unit.**
